Land Acquisition Subproject Justification	The proposed subproject does not involve land acquisition. Agrarian Service Centre Weerawila is located in a center for Wellawaya Matara and Thissamaharama Katharagama main road. Majority of the farmers are receiving their agriculture inputs, services and facilities from this ASC. At the present ASC did not have enough space to provide the services to the farmers also existing facilities not enough to meet farmers demand. The existing ASC building is old and damaged. It's complained by the farmers during the IEC campaign. Majority of the staffs at the ASC responded that, available space within the existing building was not adequate at all to provide a better service for the increased demand of the farmers. We observed barbed wire fence and gate around the ASC boundaries. Elephant movement also identified around the ASC. Therefore, construction of boundary wall is very important to protect the assets and humans. This building is very old and there is not enough space.

Gender Issues	<ul> <li>Following is a description of the gender issues concerning the communities in the impact area of the ACS:</li> <li>In the farming activities, both men and women are involved in this ASC division. However, women actively involved in land preparation, seeding, planting, weeding, preparation for marketing and they also involve in livestock management. In the farming activities, allocated payment of wages for female labour is less than the male labour.</li> <li>In the Farmer Organizations (FO) males dominate decision making process and give less opportunity for female participants even though, women are included in executive committees of farm organization as vice president, vice secretary etc.</li> <li>Women Farmer Organizations (WFO) also actively participate in each GN Divisions. However, WFOs have limited opportunities for agriculture related trainings, trainings on machinery and technology and mobilization programmes due to increasing responsibilities for women in their homes. Women farmers also faced difficulties for access the markets in proper time and they not have proper storage facilities.</li> <li>Cultural and religious barriers also affect the women's participation in rural agriculture sectors and FO activities. (Ex. Hindu, Muslim widows are not willing to actively be involved in Farmer Organizations).</li> <li>Women headed families additional problems in farming activities due to not having land ownership which restricts then from accessing water facilities and fertilizer subsidies. They are also affected by poverty, malnutrition, and mental stress.</li> <li>Women farmers are faced with more difficulties having to travel for a long time for long distances from their houses to paddy fields and walk through small pathway in the forest areas. They also do not have any safety measures to protect them from wild animals and any other dangers on route.</li> <li>In many households the males are either employed in the civil defense force, army or work outside the village. Since the civil construction works will be carried out using proper construction practices and there will be no adverse impacts on the properties, residential and other structures of the community located at a distance from the site. However, there will be some temporary impacts due to the project implementation in respect of which mitigation measures are proposed.

The contractor will also be required to employ an environmental and social officer to address any issues that may crop up during project implementation. All contractors will be required to develop and implement a code of conduct for labourers, including procedures to establish and maintain a safe working environment.

The staff and workers will be given an orientation on appropriate behaviours to ensure no disturbance to the community life and officers of the ASC. Adequate care and measures will be taken to avoid any violation of use of labour, accidents, or disputes with local communities and other risks associated with influx of non-local workers.

The contractor will also be required to employ an environmental and social officer to address any issues that may crop up during project implementation. All contractors will be required to develop and implement a code of conduct for labourers, including procedures to establish and maintain a safe working environment. The staff and workers will be given an orientation on appropriate behaviours to ensure no disturbance to the community life and officers of the ASC. Adequate care and measures will be taken to avoid any violation of use of labour, accidents, or disputes with local communities and other risks associated with influx of non-local workers.

Grievance redress mechanism will be established to allow ASC staff to raise any complaints and provide feedback regards construction activities.


