Project implementing agency:	<p>Department of Agrarian Development, Hambantota which is the implementing agency. DAD with its network of officials based in the ASCs directly involved in implementing the subproject. Similarly, the staffs of the CSIAP based in national to divisional level will also involve in different stages of the implementation process appropriately. It is expected that all the service providing agencies such as Department of Agriculture, coconut development board etc. will also support to implement the subproject effectively. From the community side, FOs, agriculture committee associated with the ASCs, WFOs will also contribute to implement the project. Similarly, the farmers in general will</p>

	support to implement the project by tolerating the difficulties that would be created during the construction period.
Specific objective and beneficiaries of the sub project:	For the ASC to function in the CSIA Project area as a sophisticated, modernized well-furnished and a resourceful one stop service center catering to present and future needs of farming community in order to increase their livelihood, income and agriculture productivity. The sub project will be implemented during the period from January to October 2020. Male: 3986 Female: 1211 will be benefited from this subproject. Also, women from all committees namely FOs, WFOs, and all women in the farming society also will benefit.
Sub Project Descriptions:	The proposed sub project of Yodakandiya Agrarian Service Centre includes following activities, Excavation and earth work, brick layer, aluminium door and windows, roofing painting and electrical installation. washroom and water supplies. The sub project will be implemented during the period from March to September 2020.
Land Acquisition	The proposed subproject does not involve land acquisition.
Subproject Justification	<p>This ASC is the 2nd largest center in this area and this is located surrounding the historically important places such as Kirinda/ Sithulpawwa/ Thissamaharamaya. This center provides the services to large farming community. Due to following limitation this ASC is unable to provide the quality services to the farmers community.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lack of space for staff • There are no facilities in the conference hall • Toilet facilities are not good enough to staffs as well as farmers. <p>Therefore, under the proposed rehabilitation project, we suggest to construct the conference hall facilities for accommodate large number of farmers for their meeting & workshops. Furthermore, toilet facilities should be enhance constructing additional toilet for Ladies and Gents.</p> <p>We assumed that cost of the conference hall included with estimated cost of ASC rehabilitation.</p>

Gender Issues	<p>Following is a description of the gender issues concerning the communities in the impact area of the ACS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In the farming activities, both men and women are involved in this ASC division. However, women actively involved in land preparation, seeding, planting, weeding, preparation for marketing and they also involve in livestock management. In the farming activities, allocated payment of wages for female labour is less than the male labour. • In the Farmer Organizations (FO) males dominate decision making process and give less opportunity for female participants even though, women are included in executive committees of farm organization as vice president, vice secretary etc. • Women Farmer Organizations (WFO) also actively participate in each GN Divisions. However, WFOs have limited opportunities for agriculture related trainings, trainings on machinery and technology and mobilization programmes due to increasing responsibilities for women in their homes. Women farmers also 																											

	<p>faced difficulties for access the markets in proper time and they not have proper storage facilities.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cultural and religious barriers also affect the women’s participation in rural agriculture sectors and FO activities. (Ex. Hindu, Muslim widows are not willing to actively be involved in Farmer Organizations). • Women headed family’s additional problems in farming activities due to not having land ownership which restricts then from accessing water facilities and fertilizer subsidies. They are also affected by poverty, malnutrition, and mental stress. • Women farmers are faced with more difficulties having to travel for a long time for long distances from their houses to paddy fields and walk through small pathway in the forest areas. They also do not have any safety measures to protect them from wild animals and any other dangers on route.

<p>Frequenting Visitors</p>	<p>Farmers (Men and Women), GO and NGO staffs, Media persons, Village and Political leaders, University Students, etc.</p>						
<p>Social Impacts Positive Impacts</p>	<p>This subproject will benefit the local population of the area, especially for farming communities. Yodakandiya Agrarian Service Center Division situated in very rural area and they not have any facilities. There nearest town is Thissamaharama. In this ASC Division 43 farmer organizations and 40 women farmer organizations are actively participated. Most farmers do not have access transport to the ASC.</p> <p>Officers at the Agrarian Service Center often do all the work without computerizing, its take lot of time to complete the work.</p> <p>For the example in the case of distribution fertilizer to the farmers, it’s taken more time and farmers have to wait three to four days due the manual system. If all activities computerize, then distribution of fertilizer can be done in one day. Also, they can save the time. The remaining time could be used for farming. Increased income due to simplification of farming activities. Save money by reducing the frequency of arrival at work efficiency.</p>						

	<p>Improve the sanitary facilities of the staff and the farmer community on a daily visit. They also able to use clean drinking water.</p>
<p>Negative Impacts</p>	<p>During office hours noise and dust from the construction work will disturb ACS officers and visiting farmers. Land for materials storage and machinery parking near the site is available which may cause some disturbances to the nearby community. A labor camp may be established and there could be impacts from labor influx - however, will be very minimum considering that only limited number of Labourers (approx. 5) may come from outside.</p> <p>There are no any sensitive areas (schools, preschools, hospitals, community centers, health centers) observed near (500m) to the construction site.</p>
<p>Mitigation Measures</p>	<p>The social issues in any infrastructure developments project are common and cannot be avoided. Also, it is important to note that the majority of social issues are emerged and aggravated due to absence necessary precautionary measures taken by the contractor.</p> <p>For example, contractor will be required to do water sprinkling to minimize impacts from dust and carry out noise generating work during day time while ensuring noise pollution is kept to the minimum. Public access to the site to be prohibited or controlled via adequate fencing and signage in order to avoid risk to the public.</p> <p>The contractor will also be required to employ an environmental and social officer to address any issues that may crop up during project implementation. All contractors will be required to develop and implement a code of conduct for Labourers, including procedures to establish and maintain a safe working environment. The staff and workers will be given an orientation on appropriate behaviors to ensure no disturbance to the community life and officers of the ASC. Adequate care and measures will be taken to avoid any violation of use of Labourers, accidents, or disputes with local communities and other risks associated with influx of non-local workers.</p> <p>Grievance redress mechanism will be established to allow ASC staff to raise any complaints and provide feedback regards construction activities.</p>
